Pastoral Musings

(For those of you who were unable to join us Christmas Eve, I give you "A Very, MARY Christmas")

Merry Christmas! Oh, YOU thought I was EXCLAMING "Merry Christmas" as in M - E - R - Y Christmas. No, no, no. I was exclaiming MARY Christmas, as in M - A - R - Y, as in Mary, the mother of our Lord.

The YOUNG woman, who conceived by the Holy Spirit, and gave birth to the Christ Child this night. *THAT* Mary. You see, here at the joint congregations of St. Stephen's and Gethsemane, well, we seem to have a perpetual issue...problem...predicament with our Mary.

The <u>FIRST</u> year I was Pastor, prior to any sort of pandemic, well, Mary was a little worse for the wear, as seen in this <u>THIS</u> photo! Yes, sadly, the mother of Baby Jesus, was sporting a rather large HOLE atop her head. Now, we tried our very best to REPAIR that hole, to PATCH that hole, heavens, to COVER UP that hole.



In the end?! It *REALLY* just made us stop and realize that **the <u>HOLE</u> - INESS of Mary** was not to be dismissed. Indeed, this young bride of Joseph carried with her this holiness, across the countryside, upon a bouncing donkey (at 9 months pregnant!) She carried this holiness to Bethlehem and back throughout Jesus's young years, as He grew in wisdom in strength.

<u>We</u>, too, get to walk alongside the Child as His wisdom strengthens in US. Through prayer, through worship, through sorrow and joy, our strength comes from God, who came to us as a baby. Mary carried this holiness with her, as she watched her little boy grow into a MAN, and gain <u>QUITE</u> the following. A following that <u>WE</u> are now a part of: a following gathered here on this holy eve, celebrating the story from thousands of years ago.

A story where there is **ROOM for YOU**, whether you warm a pew <u>each week</u>, whether this is your <u>first time</u> here, or whether you were <u>nudged</u> by Grandma to "Get in the car, we're going to church." Mary carried this holiness with her at the wedding party, where Jesus turned simple water into delicious wine. Imagine her awe at watching the same kid that once spit up over her shoulder, dazzle the wedding crowd with his FIRST Sign as he provided <u>MORE</u> than what was needed. WE receive more than WE need, each day, by a God who humbled God's self...and came down from the heavens, to dwell amongst us.

Now, mind you, the hole-y Mary from 2019 was only the *first* time I knew of Mary's troubles...

The $\underline{\textbf{NEXT}}$ time I encountered the Mother of our Lord,

well, <u>as you can</u> see, she was surrounded by **CHAOS**!

The men who surrounded her had completely fallen down on the job, not unlike what they did at the foot of the Cross. THEY had run away. while Mary stood her ground. THEY had gone into hiding while Mary was front and center, standing at the foot of the cross, beneath her son, to the very end. The SAME son whom we welcome this night. In a night where understanding the mysteries of God seems to be **ungraspable**, we're given a helpless, little human baby...that **we.can.grasp.**



From the moment the Angel Gabriel had visited Mary, she was holding the WORLD upon her shoulders, (although, if you look closely enough in the photo, she's really holding the WORLD upon her HEAD!)

Eventually, our outdoor manger was repaired, and the structure was re-built to sustain hurricane force winds and the shepherds and Joseph (and whichever Wise Men made it that year) were put back in their places, and the Nativity Scene was complete once again. But not without helping us ALL remember Mary's **resilience** when the storms of life really kick in.

Now, I'll be honest: I thought that's where the story would end. (Not, Jesus's Story - his is just beginning.) But rather, The story of "Mary's Miseries and Mishaps." But, alas, twas NOT to be! You see, I headed into work this past week, and imagine my dismay upon greeting the nativity Scene and seeing THIS!! The CROSS was still there, the STABLE was there. Even JOSEPH was still there....but, where, oh WHERE, was the Mother Mary?



Could we still have CHRISTMAS without Jesus's Mother being present? Was this a new poem?!? We all know about "Footprints in the Sand" poem...could this be a new version about "Footprints in the SNOW?"!



Well, "Fear not," said the angel, and "FEAR NOT", says your Pastor:

"When, what to my wondering eyes should appear...." but Mary, in a pick-up truck, parked near the rear! (of the church)

For there the girl sat, inside that ole Ford, the One who birthed Jesus, the One who's adored.

Her presence was jarring, hilarious - true..... but WHAT does this mean now, for me, and for YOU?

Perhaps **SHE'S** the pick-up, the LIFTER of LOVE: she brought us the Savior, come down from Above.

Or maybe she's showing us **shelter** is found, inside of a faith that is shared all around.

Or....maybe, when trees and all presents are gone, she hopes that to **JESUS** we STILL will be drawn.

The story, long-told, of a babe in the hay, still matters to **EACH** one of **US** here today.

For **Mary**? She pondered these things in her heart, For **US**? Well, the manger's a good place to start. **Amen!**

- Thoughtful, strategic conversation regarding our current state of financial affairs.
- Annual Meeting needs to include an exploration of WHY faithful giving has declined, WHAT will happen to St. Stephen's if this trend continues, WHO we can connect with to start re-giving, and **HOW** we are going to move forward in faith and trust.
- Letter received in mail from DTE outlined a cheaper partnership to provide our Gas needs.
 - After the Council Meeting, Cheri and Keith called Michigan Gas and Electric (MGE) first, to investigate whether they could match the offer and then connected with DTE to confirm the details of the offer.
 - It was determined that going with DTE instead of MGE as our supplier would save us a substantial amount of money per month. Council Members were quickly consulted, and the decision to make the switch was enacted by Cheri/Keith, who called DTE back to confirm. It will take 1-2 billing cycles for the change to take effect, there is NO requirement for a contract, and there is NO termination fee.
 - O By the numbers:
 - Currently, we pay \$0.896 for our gas costs via DTE + MGE
 - DTE letter offered **\$0.552** for switching to THEM as our supplier.
 - When Cheri & Keith called to inquire, DTE then offered us \$0.507, an even better deal!

Adult Faith Formation Class

Fridays in February 10:10 - 11:11am at St. Stephen's

This unit of study considers the third set of major characters in the Bible: Ruth, Samuel, David, and Elijah. The point of studying these stories isn't to peek under the dusty sandals of some people who died more than 3,000 years ago. **The point is to meet the living GOD!**
