




Today was the absolute worst day ever And don't try to convince me that There's something good in every day Because, when you take a closer look, This world is a pretty evil place.

I wanted to show how your day is really based on how you look at things."

The **God** who promises us new mercies each morning is the same God who sits with us in the pits of despair. The **Savior** whose first miracle enlivened a wedding party in peril is the same Savior who had nails driven through his wrists.
