

We Do!

Dear Church,

On Sunday, October 8, 2023, at Gethsemane Lutheran Church, we celebrated the double baptism of +Lena Alexis and +Neva Evalynn Stage, twin daughters of Alicia Stage, and little sisters of big brother, **Everit**.

We all watched as their mama **promised** to live into the Christian responsibilities of a parent: to **live** with the girls among God's faithful people, to **bring** the girls to the word of God and the holy supper, to **teach** them the Lord's Prayer, Creeds, and 10 Commandments, to place in their tiny, little hands the holy scriptures, and to **nurture** them in **faith** and **prayer**.



She promised to nurture **Lena** and **Neva** (as she did with Everit when he was a baby) in the Christian faith as empowered by God's Spirit, and to help them live in the covenant of baptism and in communion with the church. Then, **WE**, as the gathered **People of God**, made promises to support both **Lena** and **Neva** and **pray** for them in their lives in Christ.



Then, just **ONE** week later, these **SAME** promises were spoken over Dorothy Davis at St. Stephen's Lutheran Church on Sunday, October **15, 2023.** In the span of just 7 days, **three** daughters of God were washed in God's holy waters! Glory, hallelujah!

These are **POWERFUL** promises, Church! A **sacrament** isn't just a fancy process we do, just so folks can say they've been baptized, and then move on with life. Baptism isn't just one of those things you check-off your list of things to **do** - Baptism is one of those things you get to **BE**. We get to **BE** a part of the greater story of life and death and life again in Christ. We get to **BE** sealed by the Holy Spirit. We get to **BE** part of

the Family of God, and we get to **BE** washed in the cleansing water of God's love.

We get to join parents and sponsors - and even adults - when we say a hearty "WE DO" when asked if we will actively help the baptized **LIVE INTO** their life in Christ. These include **LOFTY** instructions, **HEAVY** responsibilities...and (most importantly) absolutely, **BEAUTIFUL** assurances! These three, daughters of God get to **BE** blessed by your ongoing support and prayers, Church. Let the "WE DO!" you proclaimed so heartily during worship translate into a continued relationship with these daughters in Christ.

Got Hope?

Pr Jim Duehring, Assistant to the Bishop and Director for Evangelical Mission

Several years ago, a very wise, incompetent person said to me, "Hope is not a strategy. "The context was not about church matters, but about a significant project involving lots of money and many, many action steps. Barriers to the goal were multitude, yet the vision of the project remained. The key people on the project were not wanting or willing to give up. I think really what he meant to say was that "wishful thinking "or "magical thinking "is not a strategy to help us move forward to achieve the outcome we want.

The Bible says a lot about HOPE. Probably the most famous passage about HOPE is from Jeremiah 29:11: "For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans for your welfare, and not for harm, to give you a future with hope." (NRSV) Romans 8:25 is helpful: "But if we hope for what we do, do not see, we wait for it with patience." (NRSV)



Pastor Eugene Petersen, author of the message version of the Bible, wrote the following in his book, **A Long**Obedience in the Same Direction: Discipleship in an Instant Society:

Hope defined, hoping does not mean doing nothing... It means going about our assigned tasks, confident that God will provide the meaning and the conclusions. It is not compelled to work away at keeping up appearances with a bogus spirituality. It is the opposite of desperate and panicky, manipulations, of scurrying and worrying. And hoping is not dreaming. It is not spinning and illusion, or fantasy to protect us from our boredom or our pain. It means a confident, alert, expectation that God will do what he said he will do. It is imagination put in the harness of faith. It is a willingness to let God do it his way, and in his time. It is the opposite of making plans that we demand that God put into effect, telling him both how and when to do it."

I really like what Petersen says about **HOPE**. There's a lot of solid wisdom, and perspective contained in those words above. I'm glad we have many churches with HOPE in their name. Here in Marquette, we have HOPE – a shared ministry of four Methodist ministries. I've never run across a church named, "No Hope Here."

There are a lot of things and institutions that we have lost hope in. Most people have no hope that Congress can run efficiently. I still don't want to give up. Hope in that matter because we need good leadership and decision-making in Congress. I will try to stay informed. I will vote. Most importantly, I will pray for our nation's leaders, no matter my personal feelings about them.

I don't have hope that I will get back to my weight at age 17. But, I'm still trying to lose some weight and exercise. I don't have hope that I will become an astronaut. That was my dream as a young boy, but I will keep looking up at the stars, and stand in amazement of it all. I don't have hope that all our churches will see a grand influx of youth, coming back to our churches, or all our adults, engaging in Bible Study, or all our budget projections being perfectly met, or all of our pastors/LLM's and council leaders always agreeing with each other, and never experiencing challenges and conflicts. But I have HOPE in the power of God to look at the "dry bones "of our lives and church institutions, and declare to us, "you are my beloved. I can still breathe my spirit in you. I'm not going to abandon you, even though you may have abandoned me. "

I have hope not, because I have a crystal ball for the future, but because I have seen and felt God and God's people come through many a storm in the past. I also read throughout the scriptures that God is a God of hope. Without a sense of hope, we can lapse into nihilistic, chaotic, self-fulfilling, doom, and gloom. I don't want to live like that. I don't want to see the people and the world around me like that.

I will continue to cling to (NRSV), not as a magical dream, but as my faith in a God, who loves this world. And I sure hope that God will help me and you live out the vision of God's loving and just purposes for all. God gave us **HOPE**!

November 2023: Luke 16:1-13 - "The Dishonest Steward"

- 16 Then Jesus said to the disciples, "There was a rich man who had a manager, and charges were brought to him that this man was squandering his property. ² So he summoned him and said to him, 'What is this that I hear about you? Give me an accounting of your management because you cannot be my manager any longer.'
- ³ Then the manager said to himself, 'What will I do, now that my master is taking the position away from me? I am not strong enough to dig, and I am ashamed to beg. ⁴ I have decided what to do so that, when I am dismissed as manager, people may welcome me into their homes.' ⁵ So, summoning his master's debtors one
 - by one, he asked the first, 'How much do you owe my master?' ⁶ He answered, 'A hundred jugs of olive oil.' He said to him, 'Take your bill, sit down quickly, and make it fifty.' ⁷ Then he asked another, 'And how much do you owe?' He replied, 'A hundred containers of wheat.' He said to him, 'Take your bill and make it eighty.'
- ⁸ And his master commended the dishonest manager because he had acted shrewdly, for the children of this age are more shrewd in dealing with their own generation than are the children of light. ⁹ And I tell you, make friends for yourselves by means of dishonest wealth so that when it is gone they may welcome you into the eternal homes.
- ¹⁰ "Whoever is faithful in a very little is faithful also in much, and whoever is dishonest in a very little is dishonest also in much. ¹¹ If, then, you have not been faithful with the dishonest wealth, who will entrust to you the true riches? ¹² And if you have not been faithful with what belongs to another, who will give you what is your own? ¹³ No slave can serve two masters, for a slave will either hate the one and love the other or be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and wealth."

 - 3. Where might God's Spirit be nudging you in this passage?
