Pastoral Musings

(For those of you who were unable to join us Christmas Eve..)



Merry Christmas, dear Church.

As we gather in the **quiet** of this hallowed eve, with the **tree** aglow, delightful **decorations**, **poinsettias** a-plenty, **family** squished next to you in the pew, the **manger** scene outside in **place**...

You know...yeah.....let's PAUSE for a moment, and talk about that **Manger**. Might I **remind** you that it has **NOT** been an **easy** path to set-up that **manger**!?!



Year after year, we <u>stumble</u> into **ONE** adventure after another! I mean, **WHO** could forget the **Winter** of <u>2019</u>, where <u>THIS</u> very **HOLE-Y Mary** was part of the scene.







The story of "Mary's Many Miseries and Mishaps" was not even **CLOSE** to being over, because she went **MISSING** the next year...Only to be **discovered** - perfectly safe in the back of a **pick-up truck** seen **HERE!**





So, THIS year, we were **DETERMINED** to have our **ducks** in a row, or make that our **Disciples** and **Devotees** in a row. So, <u>THIS</u> year, as you can <u>see</u>.. Oh, for St. Peter's sake!!! THIS is what I found when checking out the Nativity <u>THIS</u> year: (And NO, I did not PUT them in this order...This is how I FOUND them!): A shepherd boy with 2 little sheep, a bunch of kings who don't technically arrive for another month (let alone the don't arrive for 2 more YEARS in the actual timeline). Don't miss timid Joseph, peeking out from 5th in line, and Mary and the baby, hiding behind it all!

Not only did it make me **laugh**, to, once again, see these **characters**, all **hiding** behind the church sign outside...But, it also made me **think**: might **WE** want to **hide** a little bit from the **chaos** and **crazy** of our **OWN** lives sometimes? All those squeaky-clean, **calendars** you might **receive** over the next few days, proclaiming the **new year** ahead, will **QUICKLY** be **filled** with appointments and practices, meetings and games. Each little, white **square** that stood so perfectly **blank** and **clean**...will be **chock-full** with details and numbers and names and places. **Maybe**, it's ok to take a **moment** every once in a while, to **hide** behind the **strength** of a shepherd, or to hide behind the **wisdom** of a king, or even to hide away with a tiny **BABY**.



NOW, **thankfully**, the Nativity Crew pulled things together, and we have a perfectly, delightful Manger Scene, as seen HERE. Kings in place, Mary, Joseph and the baby. Apparently, the SHEEP have garland this year – WHATEVER. The Shepherd Boy is in place with his mini-flock AND...

Wait a minute...!!! Please ZOOM in...



Zoom in ONE more time... LILLIAN ANN! How did YOU get into the manger!? Why, look at THIS – even Berkley can't believe her little Church friend found her way into the Manger!



OH, LILY! My goodness, there she is: all 3 and a half years of spunk, nestled between the Holy Family and the Shepherd Boy. Now, if you've heard me preach before, you've heard me say this phrase: Faith is CAUGHT more than it is TAUGHT. Meaning, kids (of ALL ages) catch on to the workings of a faith grounded in Jesus by CATCHING-ON to the words and songs and activities they see around them. They CATCH ON much faster and much deeper than if we sat those same folks down and simply bored them to death with teachings and tests. (And that's coming from a former elementary school music teacher!)

Faith is <u>CAUGHT</u> more than it is <u>TAUGHT</u>. Nobody <u>made</u> Lily hug the Shepherd Boy in the manger that day, it's just something she *instinctively* did. She REACHED OUT IN <u>LOVE</u>. Lily wasn't concerned with the hustle and bustle that <u>WE</u> place on that manger scene from so long ago. She wasn't concerned with the fact that "there was no room for them in the inn." She FOUND room, and jumped RIGHT into the story, something we Pastors try and encourage folks to do EVERY TIME you hear the word of God: WONDER where you would have FIT into some of those wild stories. Lily saw her place RIGHT THERE, in that little, make-shift, birthing room, right next to the Son of God and his family and friends. She jumped right in.

Church, it can be that simple. It can be that pure. When WE cast a worrisome shadow of panic into this ancient story, when we insert frantic anxiety over finding a place to give birth, when we cast our own FEARS on the story of that night in Bethlehem, we cheat ourselves out of CATCHING a little of that FAITH we're could have been FEELING all along! Take Verse 6 from our Gospel, for example. It says that "while they were there," Mary was ready to give birth. A better interpretation or translation, should really read "while they had been there for a bit.... Mary had the baby." Meaning, we can picture the family being settled a bit, instead of frantically running around, having just arrived, because Mary's water had just broken and the baby was coming. NOW. Whoooa. Slow it down a bit. Take the story in.

CATCH the faith of Joseph, knowing - TRUSTING, really, he'd find a place. When WE project our OWN concern over them being **FORCED** to go and participate in the **Census**, we **rob** ourselves of the not-sohidden **blessings** that came out of this story of old. I mean, I'm **NOT** going to speak for a pregnant woman about the about the 90-miles it took to **GET** there, but perhaps the **journey** itself was a blessing,

Joseph was coming **HOME** to a whole bunch of **people** who'd were excited to see him, AND his **partner** was about to give birth. They had returned to his **family**'s hometown so, you just **KNOW**.... "that there was an **AUNTIE** there, somewhere in the background, just prepping a warm **blanket** or 5 to swaddle the kid. I mean there was **NO ROOM** for them at the house, my **GAWSH**, but they weren't going to let the **kid** go **COLD**! "

CATCH the **FAITH** of a kid who doesn't **judge** the stable for not being a 3-story Barbie Dream House. (ICK). It's a bunch of **wood** nailed together (mind you, it's been fortified to withstand those hurricane-force winds we talked about earlier), but's it's simple wood. Providing simple shelter. For a simple family. And Lily just scooted right up to that family.



That's the ENTIRE POINT of Christmas. CHURCH: **Scooting closer to Christ.** Every one of you who came to this service tonight, whether you come every week (or were thrown into the family vehicle tonight!) took ONE little scoot, closer to Christ. ONE little scoot, closer to God. It's the whole reason God came to earth. God gave a child named Jesus to US on Earth, so that US on earth could be closer to God. As in, hands-on, totally-embraced, hugging-the-shepherd boy-next-to-you, kind of CLOSE.

Catch the faith of a kid who jumped into a manger this night:

Pr. Brenda the cute one named Lily, who came to bring us JOY and the saving One named Jesus, who came to bring us LOVE. AMEN!

I fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me.


