Dwelling in the Word: May 2024 Luke 8:4-15: Parable of the Sower

- 1. What catches your attention?
- 2. What questions does this passage raise for you?
- 3. Where might God's Spirit be nudging you in this passage?
- <sup>4</sup> When a large crowd was gathering, as people were coming to him from town after town, he said in a parable: <sup>5</sup> "A sower went out to sow his seed, and as he sowed some fell on a path and was trampled on, and the birds of the air ate it up. <sup>6</sup> Some fell on rock, and as it grew up it withered for lack of moisture. <sup>7</sup> Some fell among thorns, and the thorns grew with it and choked it. <sup>8</sup> Some fell into good soil, and when it grew it produced a hundredfold."



- As he said this, he called out, "If you have ears to hear, then hear!" <sup>9</sup> Then his disciples asked him what this parable meant. <sup>10</sup> He said, "To you it has been given to know the secrets of the kingdom of God, but to others I speak in parables, so that 'looking they may not perceive and hearing they may not understand.'
- <sup>11</sup> "Now the parable is this: The seed is the word of God. <sup>12</sup> The ones on the path are those who have heard; then the devil comes and takes away the word from their hearts, so that they may not believe and be saved. <sup>13</sup> The ones on the rock are those who, when they hear the word, receive it with joy. But these have no root; they believe only for a while and in a time of testing fall away. <sup>14</sup> As for what fell among the thorns, these are the ones who hear, but as they go on their way they are choked by the cares and riches and pleasures of life, and their fruit does not mature. <sup>15</sup> But as for that in the good soil, these are the ones who, when they hear the word, hold it fast in an honest and good heart and bear fruit with endurance.

## **Pastoral Musings**

Rev. Brenda L. Greenwald

**Dear Church**, I wanted to share with you the message I spoke to the 2024 Graduating Class of Stephenson High School.

Fr. Brenda

**STOP. DROP. and ROLL. It's** one of the **VERY** first drills we practice as children. If for some reason you find yourself **ON FIRE** (not recommended) you're told to **STOP** what you're doing, **DROP** to the ground, and **ROLL** over and over so that the fire is totally smothered. Pretty practical advice. I figure if it's important enough to be one of your **FIRST** lessons, then, I think it's important enough to be one of your **LAST**.

**STOP** yourself from comparing **YOUR** life to <u>others</u>. **DROP** the pretense that you have to measure up to those *around* you. **ROLL** those harmful thoughts over to the God who made YOU...YOU. **YOU** are FEARFULLY and WONDERFULLY made! **Psalm 139** reminds you of this! **You**. In your OWN right. All your QUIRKS. All your HABITS. All your PERSONALITY. Own it. God made YOU, just as you are. Don't apologize for it. Give THANKS for it! Live INTO it.

**STOP** panicking when failure seems imminent. **DROP** those stressed-out **shoulders** from holding up your ears. **ROLL** your furrowed-brow back to its original position, and **BREATHE**. You can't do much in life if you can't **BREATHE**. God gave us the breath of LIFE to LIVE life...mistakes and all. You're going to miss turning-in that paper on time. **Breathe**. You're going to blow an interview at least once. **Breathe**. You're going to forget to pay that bill. **Breathe**. **Breathe** yourself back to the **grace** that covers you, even when things go awry.

**STOP** yourself from **saying** things you'll regret. **DROP** the foul language, and **ROLL** out your thoughts from a place of **CARE**. So often, the quickest and wittiest comebacks slice **deeper** than we intend. Find ways to let others **shine** – and **cheer** them on. Find ways to build others **up** – and **applaud** their efforts. Let the words of **YOUR** 



mouths, and the meditations of YOUR hearts...be acceptable...be encouraging...be full of LOVE.

STOP yourself from thinking that YOU are in this world ALONE. DROP the idea that you have to be SELF-made or SELF-reliant. ROLL into those God-given people who will be there to catch you. We hand you a diploma in a few days, and you get kicked-loose from an educational system that watched you grow. But along with that little document of SUCCESS comes ALL the LOVE and ALL the SUPPORT and ALL the PRAYERS that will CONTINUE to go with you. Whether you are headed to a job, or more schooling, or the family business, KNOW. SENSE. FEEL. that there are GOD-GIVEN PEOPLE who will STILL LISTEN on the other end of a phone, who will STILL REPLY to those latenight texts, who will STILL REACH OUT when the voicemail sounded sad. Don't pretend you have it all together....none of us DO! We're in this together. We're ALL just trying our best.

And, so, I **sincerely pray** that you **heed** the precautionary phrase of **STOP. DROP. and ROLL.** I hope you have **reason** to put it into **action**. (I mean, without the <u>FIRE</u> part, of course.) But that you have reason to **STOP** holding back **DROP** any fears and **ROLL** into what comes next in your life. May God bless **YOU** and the **FIRE** within your **souls**. **AMEN**.
