Practical Wisdom

A Letter by Brian Morykon

Dear Church, this month's article is by a musician whom I have come to know through Renovaré, a Christian resource group that has strengthened my faith and discipleship over the years. Brian 's powerful words deserve a read, and I commend them to you.

"Practical wisdom for abiding in and becoming more like Jesus." When disaster strikes—as it does with alarming frequency these days—a community often experiences an initial surge of compassion, energy, resolve, and unity. Then comes the long slog of rebuilding with its accompanying frustration and fatigue. This pattern is true not just of a community struck by tragedy, but with any community that comes together for a purpose—like a worshiping community.

I think of a church plant that initially bursts with life and hope. Then the weight of the weekly work sets in. Meetings become monotonous. Personality cracks are uncovered. And you begin to wonder if doing life together is even worth it.

Bonhoeffer's classic by that title, *Life Together*, can help us here. He says that Christians should bear one another—not just to be there in a hard time, but to allow our brother or sister the **freedom** to be who they are. And who they are is almost always different from who we want them to be.

"Bearing" doesn't mean that we learn to "put up" with people in community while resentment festers under a forced smile. **Instead**, we cooperate with God to come to love and even to like people in spite of in some cases, because of—their idiosyncrasies. "To bear the burden of the other person means involvement with the created reality of the other, to accept and affirm it, and in bearing with it, to break through to the point where we take joy in it."

One way to bear one another well—that is, to love one another well—is to **hold our tongues**. Yes, Sally is strange. Yes, Peter has problems. And maybe at some point—if we're committed to their good and they've invited us to speak into their lives—we address them directly about some destructive pattern in their lives. But talking around them or about them almost always harms, even if it's under the guise of praying for them. (The Devil gets a special kick out of prayer-request-gossip.) There are special cases where it is appropriate to talk about someone's flaws with the real intent of how to help that person. But for the most part, a bitten tongue beats a loose one.

The **health** of a community—in times of peril or in times of peace—hangs on its lips. "Bear with each other," says Saint Paul. "Forgive as the Lord forgave you. Be thankful. Let the message of Christ dwell among you richly."

Lord, I'm convicted. It can be fun to talk—or think—poorly about people to feel better about myself. Forgive me and teach me. You have the words of life. Your silence speaks. Help us learn your way with one another, Amen.

Our Quilters have once again demonstrated their enduring commitment to community and global outreach. In a heartwarming display of creativity and compassion, **102** beautifully handcrafted **quilts** adorned the Sanctuary, filling the space with vibrant colors and intricate designs. These quilts, each lovingly stitched by hand, represent not just the talent of the quilters, but also the Church's dedication to making a tangible difference in the lives of others.





Over the past months, the **congregation** rallied together, contributing to a summer-long collection of school supplies. This effort resulted in the assembly of **75 backpacks** filled with essential items – pencils, notebooks, rulers, and more – ensuring that children in need, across the world, will have the tools necessary for their education. Additionally, **10 fabric kits** were prepared to support the livelihoods of families in communities facing hardship. The school supply kits, alongside the quilts, reflect the collective efforts of many hands, hearts, and prayers.

Last month, the sanctuary's warmth was not only from the visual beauty of the quilts but from the spirit of giving that filled the room. All **102** quilts and the **75** backpack school supply kits, along with the **10** fabric kits, were **blessed** in worship, and carefully packed up and prepared for their journey. An additional **3** quilts were made for Graduates,



4 quilts given to victims of a local fire, 2 quilts were sold, and 3 were given to Fortune Lake Lutheran Camp – 2 for the staff, and 1 for their Annual Fall Fest. The quilts and kits have since been loaded into the **Boxcar**, ready to be

transported for distribution through the world. This annual tradition highlights the strength of a community united in service, providing comfort and support to those they may never meet, but whose lives they touch deeply.

We extend a **heartfelt thank you** to everyone who contributed, whether through stitching a quilt, donating school supplies, or offering encouragement and prayers. Your generosity makes a world of difference! **Thank you for supporting and participating in this ministry of care and compassion!**

raise funds for the HVAC system, God's Work, Our Hands Sunday when we packed-up 75 Celebration kits for the Food Pantry and 75 school bags for LWR, and Top the Tater with proceeds going to our Eagles

Wings Fund!

WELCA: Activities include the purchase of silverware for the church kitchen with a generous donation and WELCA

dollars; banners made for baptisms along with the purchase of cupcakes for Fellowship Hour following

those services. A quilt has been quilted by Ann and sent to FLLC for their Fall Fest auction on 10/5!

Worship/Music: Several special services happened throughout the summer including: 3 baptisms, Worship in the

Park/Picnic, blessing of the quilts, Schuette/Wangerin wedding, funeral for +Zeke Gill+. At Sunday Worship during August, we enjoyed special music with hymn selections from the Hymn Hat! And in
