TREASURER'S REPORT + FINANCIAL SECRETARY

- 1. Written Reports May, June, July, August 2024: similar in giving to 2023
- 2. Discussion of Fraudulent charges to a Scammer Selling "QuickBooks"
 - An e-mail offering "6 years of coverage for only \$900" was received by Treasurer. To be fair, this would have been a delightful and cost-effective deal.
 - The Treasurer ran this deal past both Cheri and John of Council, with them agreeing to the purchase, if indeed it was necessary for the Treasurer to do her job. Pastor B, however, was not consulted, and would have been able to catch multiple red flags: QuickBooks rarely locks people in for a multiple-year contract, 6-years is an odd number of years for a deal, the e-mail address itself looked suspicious, and the name of the company was not properly capitalized. Seeing as how Pr B is the main tech-support at St. Stephen's, this was an unfortunate step to skip.
 - The Treasurer then authorized the expense, even after Nicolet Bank called to verify what was flagged on their end as a possibly, fraudulent charge.
 - The Treasurer additionally allowed the Scammers remote, digital access to the main Office computer at St. Stephen's, giving them visual access to our real, QuickBook and bank accounts.
 - Ultimately, the Treasurer realized the error, and notified Pr B.
 - All St. Stephen's accounts (nearly a dozen) were frozen by Nicolet Bank to ensure no additional
 fraudulent charges could be made. Two charges of \$105 were noted, but the money was returned
 when flagged as fraudulent. As of this meeting, the \$900 was still in question, as it had been
 verified and allowed by the Treasurer.
 - Pr Brenda had to digitally scrub the Office computer completely clean before the bank would give us internet access to our accounts once again. This meant that Pr B had to save all of the data on each of the 5 accounts on Office Computer (*Treasurer*, *Office*, *Financial Secretary*, *Guest*, *Pastor*) to an external hard-drive so that our Office files were not lost in the digital scrub. Then, Microsoft 360 (which provides the software programs of Word, Excel, PowerPoint, Outlook) had to be re-purchased and reinstalled on each of the accounts on this computer, and bookmarks that allowed each user to go about their work needed to be reestablished.

FOLLOW-UP: On October 4th, the \$900 was successful re-captured by Nicolet Bank, resulting in a total of NO MONEY LOST by these devious scammers. Whew!

Empowerment Beyond Abuse

A little Rainbow House history: In 1978, a group of women concerned with the increase of domestic violence came together and formed a Task Force to pursue the development of a program. The organization operated as an information and referral service for many years prior to acquiring a shelter facility in 1982. Rainbow House provided education and information on stopping the cycle of domestic violence. They've been in their current location, serving survivors since 1984. They established as an independent non-profit in 1993, and continue to serve victims today, through providing prevention, education, and information to communities, families, and schools.
